# FOR YOUR BENEFIT

## Don't lose out

Remember - if you have non dependent children living in your household, this could affect how much housing benefit you receive. If you have a child who left full time education in the summer and isn't yet employed, make sure



they're claiming any benefit they're entitled to.

## It's coming!

#### **Universal Credit is still on its way!**

It'll be fully implemented in the North West by the end of the year and then rolled out to the rest of the country from February 2015.

If your rent is currently paid by Housing Benefit, once Universal Credit comes in, it'll be your responsibility to pay. We suggest you pay an extra £3 - £5 per week now to get your rent account in credit.

# It's SNOW time!



Do you want to build a snowman? Here's a great simple Snowman Cupcake recipe for all ages. Give it a go and send your photos of your finished cakes to

#### **Ingredients**

100g butter or margarine

100q qolden caster suqar

2 eggs

100g self raising flour

1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp vanilla essence

Icing sugar for dusting

150g ready to roll white icing

3 tbsp apricot jam

Marshmallows

Red fizzy laces

Tubes of coloured writing icing

Sugar or silver baubles

#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas 4.
- Place the butter or margarine, sugar, eggs, flour, baking powder and vanilla essence into a bowl and beat until the mixture is light and fluffy.
- 3. Line a bun tin with 8 paper cases and divide the mixture between them. Bake for about 20 minutes until the cakes are lightly golden.
- 4. Lift out of the tins and leave to cool on a wire rack.
- 5. Dust a clean working surface with icing sugar and roll out the icing to about 5mm thick. Cut out 8 circles the same size as the top of your cakes.
- 6. Put the apricot jam into a small dish and stir in 1 tablespoon of hot water. Brush this over the cakes and stick the icing circles on top.
- 7. Make the snowman's head by sticking a marshmallow on the top of each cake using apricot jam.
- 8. Wrap a fizzy lace around each head and use writing icing for the eyes and mouth. Stick sugar baubles on with writing icing for the nose and buttons.

# Emillion funding

A recent report revealed that house prices are a whopping 107% higher in the Peak District than in the rest of Derbyshire!

With the need for affordable housing greater than ever, around a million pounds of funding is being made available to build affordable homes in the Peak District.

The majority is being awarded by the Homes and Communities Agency and supplemented

by local authorities. This means that four new schemes, each comprising four homes, can be developed during the next four years. Litton will start next year, followed by Taddington, Winster and Ashford in the Water.
